

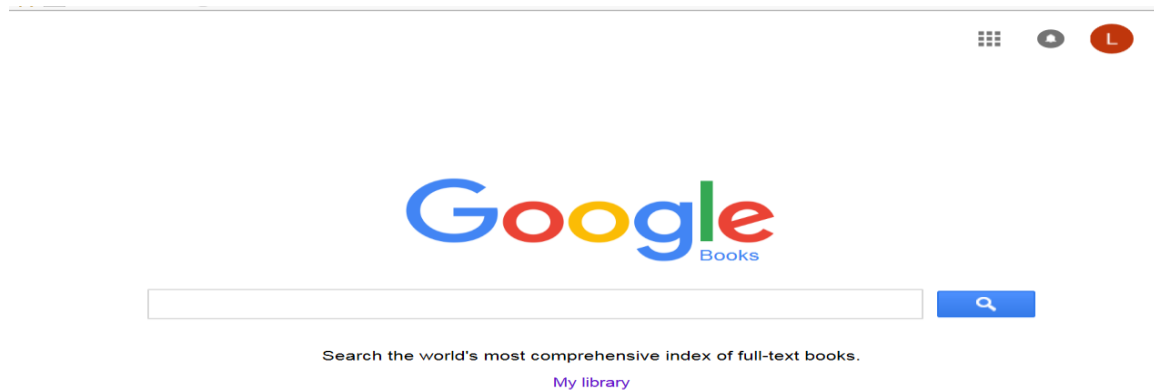

Great for your college work, giving you access to more scholarly resources. You can search for: articles, theses, books, abstracts etc.

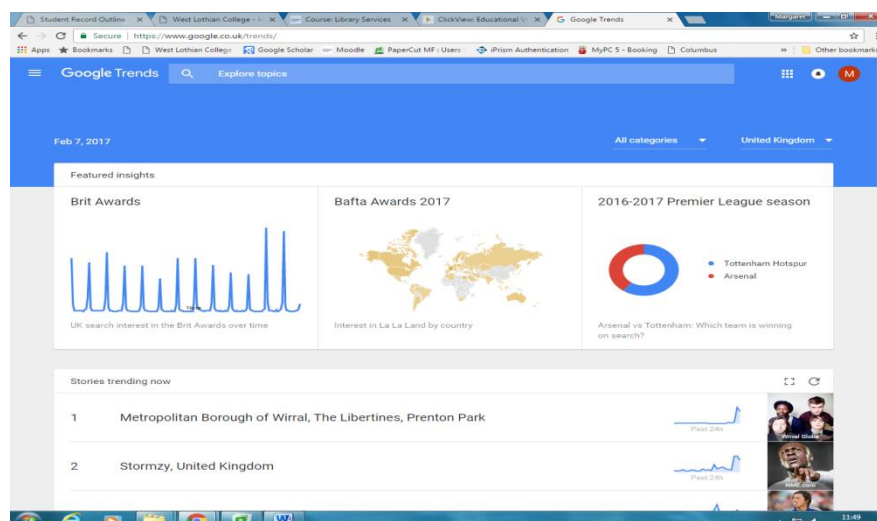
### Google Books
